

North Mississippi Medical Center Selects Eclipsys to Enhance System-Wide Clinical Technology

**– Conversion to Integrated Clinical Solution Suite Extends Long-Term Technology Partnership;
Supports Improved Safety and Quality Goals; Represents Largest Contract in Recent Company History**

NMMC holds the distinction of being among the few healthcare organizations in the United States to win the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award, the nation's highest Presidential honor for organizational performance excellence. As the largest private hospital in Mississippi and the largest non-metropolitan hospital in America, NMMC has been a long-standing leader in the use of health information technology, using information to drive continuous improvements in clinical performance. The health system is consistently named as one of "America's 25 Most Wireless" and "100 Most Wired Hospitals and Health Systems."

"We are committed to providing our patients with consistent high-quality care and taking full advantage of technologies that share evidence-based guidelines and support reducing variability in care," said John Heer, chief executive officer of North Mississippi Health Services, which includes NMMC and NMMC Women's Hospital in Tupelo, as well as community hospitals in Eupora, Iuka, Pontotoc and West Point, MS, and Hamilton, AL. "By undertaking this broader technology initiative, including adoption of Eclipsys' computerized physician order entry solution, we're equipping physicians with in-depth research clinical content at the point of care, as well as easy, secure access to the latest patient information from their offices, homes or other locations."

According to the KLAS CPOE Digest 2009: Meaningful Use and Physician Adoption report, Eclipsys leads the industry in total physicians live on CPOE and percentage of its client base using its system.
